

Do I need a power plug adapter on the Cook Islands?

On the Cook Islands, they use power sockets (outlets) of type I, like in Australia. Your plugs fit into the power sockets on the Cook Islands. You don't need a power plug adapter. What type of plug does Cook Islands use?

For Cook Islands, there is one associated plug type: type I. Cook Islands operates on a 240V supply voltage and 50Hz. In Cook Islands the power sockets used are of type I. Use the photo below to help identify the right plug and socket. Plug adapters are the interfaces between the American flat-pronged plug and Cook Islands' three flat-prong socket.

What type of power sockets are on the Cook Islands?

The power sockets on the Cook Islands are of type I. The standard voltage is 240 V at a frequency of 50 Hz. Check your need for a power plug (travel) adapter on the Cook Islands.

What voltage does Cook Islands use?

The voltage in Cook Islands is the same as in Europe. However, Europeans will need a travel adapter when traveling to Cook Islands. What Outlet does Cook Islands Use? Type I plug sockets are used in Australia, New Zealand. They have two flat pins and a grounding pin. These plugs are typically used with devices that have a voltage of 230V.
